

Collective Worship

#Bring Courage!

This term's Christian value is courage. It is also National Anti-Bullying Week. In school, we looked at examples of bullying and talked about what we can do to stop it.



In collective worship, we explored how Jesus stuck up for people who were bullied by others. One man, Zacchaeus, was hated by other people because he worked for the Romans. Jesus approached him and asked to be his friend. This kind action changed Zacchaeus and he gave up working for the Romans. Another time, a group of people wanted to put a woman to death. Jesus quietly said to them, "Let he who is without sin cast the first stone." And they walked off, embarrassed. **His example shows we can speak up and stand our ground, without violence.** Many people think you can beat a bully by fighting them - but what really happens is you turn into a bully, too!
